Sydney, the Samoyed show and more

When the dogs began their classes (the dogs where shown on Saturday and bitches on Sunday along with the 'In Show' finals) it was an amazing sight to see, when you have numbers like 14 dogs in 'Intermediate', 25 in 'Australian Bred' and 22 in 'Open', it truly is an impres-

sive sight to see that many dogs in the ring and with similar numbers on the Sunday for the bitches, you could be forgiven for not remembering all that went on.

It was great not having to groom and prepare any dogs. You could talk to people, take photographs and watch all that was going on without the pressure of "how long have we got before we are on".

I was also most impressed with the judge, Mrs J Nonhof (Moonlighter Samoyeds, USA) if not only for her memory and her patience (she was smiling all the way through for both days) and for the superb job she did. She had a mammoth task of picking first, the placings of each split class and then the final line up, how she managed it I do not know, but she did. The Best In Show winner, Aust. CH. Kalaska Sheer Excellence (Lenny) did her judging 'justice', as he is a dog with 'show presence' and was expertly handled By Jamie Beard (Kalaska Kennels). Not only was 'Lenny' very well presented, but so where all the other Samoyeds.



Please send me photos of your dogs to go into our photo page and anything else you may think will be of interest.



My 1st SI ed Race Experi ence

It all started when staying with friends in Christchurch who are into racing Siberians and Malamutes. I asked if I could put my dogs in harness and take a picture 'for a laugh'! Sure, Nathan said, we can take them out and give them a go if you don't mind getting your powder puffs dirty. Well that was that, I was hooked! What an awesome experience to be pulled by my babies!



My first race was in the forests of Hamner Springs on the 31st July this year. Due to illness my training hadn't gone as planned, but I was keen as keen to give it a go. I was running in a 2 dog scooter race with Sharna (NZ Ch Penza Snow Mist), my 91/2 year old bitch and Zeus (NZ Ch Vashka Song and Dance, Imp Aust) my 41/2 year old show dog. Sharna was the confident puller and Zeus was the fit runner. Originally he was a bit unsure on what to do, but he soon had picked it up with Sharna doing the hard work initially (typical Crossing the line was an amazing Male leaving the hard work to the Girl!). The race was just under 5km in distance and we had one Saturday night and another Sunday morning. I had never ran the dogs 2 days consecutively, so this alone was an achievement in its own!

Saturday morning was my first experience watching the rig teams go out for the longer races. What an overwhelming experience it was with excited dogs literally screaming and jumping in the air wanting to run, very deafening to be there!

We were racing at about 5pm so it was not quite as cold as it had

been at 7am in the morning in the middle of the forest - learnt that thermals are a wonderful thing, and next time takes even more!!!!

I was the 2nd team to go out, so was very nervous as couldn't watch any others go, Nathan and Cheryl, Andy and Denise and many others were very helpful, and my good friend Hannah came to help me too. Waiting at the start line was really nerve wrecking – was I going to make it??? 10 seconds, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 and we were off. Had a slight tangle on the start line, but the dogs took off well and were great with other teams passing. I had never even trained with any others before. let alone raced! They loved to chase and I was very pleased with how they went. Sharna struggles with her age and on the 2nd part of the course it became evident that her speed was not as good as Zeus, but she is a real wee puller and has a big heart. The last 800 metres up hill was a challenge as I had bronchitis at the time and was struggling with my fitness due to this. When everyone on the finish Now I no what it is all about my dogs line started calling the dog's names they took off again and ran again well for home.

high! I was exhausted and had nothing more left in me, as were they! People appeared in all directions to take the dogs, my scooter, and look after them for me so I could recover, it was so touching to have people help and care for the dogs so much.

The next morning was an early start so off I went again, this time 4th from last so more time to watch others and not near as nervous as it was the same course and so I knew where to go. It was evident that the dogs were very tired from the day before as even Zeus gave Silvamist Samoyeds, Nelson up going full speed about 200metres out from the start (or maybe

he got smart to it!). Andy Reeves and I had a great time tootling around the course and he was a real help to me as I was really struggling health wise myself. Coming to the last hill he overtook me and even called my dogs to get them running again, this was awesome sportsmanship, something that would be great to see more of in all aspects of the dog world! On the home strait I caught up to about 1 metre behind and it was a 'drag race' to the finish line with the 2 Samoyed teams! Wish I had had a photo as it would have looked so neat! My guys ran out off puff about 20metres from the finish so finished just behind Andy, Tyson and Demon. Once again helpers were on hand to take care of dogs so I could recover!

At prize giving I was congratulated on my first races and treated in such a positive, encouraging way, it was such a nice feeling. My first race was completed in 18minutes and Sundays was 21minutes, showing that yes, the dogs were stuffed (so was their Mum)!!!!

I uncovered some incredible dealings there and was awarded a batch of medals. Had a wife, a mess of puppies, and now I'm just retired."

Chocol ate toxi c to

ow many times have you heard someone confess that they love chocolate themselves and sometimes give their dog a few pieces although they have heard that it is not good for dogs and could make them sick?

That is, unfortunately, quite a common occurrence but the truth is that you are not doing your dog any favours as far as health is concerned. Chocolate contains theobromine, a toxicant responsible for causing canine illness. Signs of theobromine poisoning include vomiting, excessive thirst, diarrhoea, restlessness and agitation.

These signs usually develop in six to eight hours. Kidney damage, seizures, heart rhythm irregularities and death may result, in severe cases. There is no real antidote for a theobromine overdose. Support and care can be given, and vomiting can be induced if the poisoning is recognised early enough. Obviously the best course of action is not to feed your dog chocolate to begin with and to be sure to hide your own chocolate stash so your dog can't help himself!

Luckily this seems to be what usually happens - human owners with a chocoholic habit do not want their dog to find and demolish their

stores, so are generally careful about where they keep them. Perhaps the biggest danger could be from visitors or children who may leave chocolate they have brought with them, or been given, in an accessible place, such as on a coffee table.

White chocolate, however, follows different rules. Some dog treats are available dipped in white chocolate. Is this safe?

The answer is yes. Regular dark chocolate is made from cacao beans, the source of high levels of theobromine, a caffeine-like substance. White chocolate, on the other tect you hand, is made from cocoa butter, which is safe for dogs. feeling of The amount of theobromine in powdered cocoa varies, but it can be quite high. Usually, the darker the chocolate the higher the theobromine content. The amount of caffeine in different chocolate products is also extremely variable. For example, unsweetened baking chocolate reputedly has up to 10 times the caffeine of milk chocolate.

This means that as an afterdinner snack or supper treat, white chocolate is less likely to keep you awake half the night than dark chocolate. So used only on very special what about the chocolate nibbles made especially for dogs substitute for some TLC - do they contain theobromine? The answer here is no. owner. Manufacturers have formu-

lated them to contain extra vitamins and minerals and to have various added qualities.

They are made especially for dogs, and although they are called choc drops, the name is not accurate - they are made of carob, and are therefore quite safe.

If you eat chocolate yourself you may like to keep a packet of 'chocolate' treats for your dog so that you can give him/her a treat when you succumb to the nibble habit yourself (and

However, you must remember that dogs are always healthier without chocolate in any form and even the specially produced treats should be occasions - not as a daily from you as the dog's

1. Polar Blazin Aces At Kimskaya (Mathers/ Magnus)

A very attractive pup with a good head and good feet, moved well, fair coat. A fraction heavy.

JUNIOR DOG (1 entered)

1. Silvertips A Touch of Magic (Carleton) Nice Head, good feet, good chest, fair coat. Also heavier than I prefer. Junior In Show.

INTERMEDIATE DOG (2 entered)

1. Ch Skrownek Sev Kazeel (Andrew) Very good head, strong neck with a good depth of chest and length of leg. Moved with purpose. Challenge Dog and Best In Show.

2. Skrownek Chagall (Stewart)
In good coat, a little full in eye and heavier in head than the winner, out moved.

LIMIT DOG (2 entered)

1. Kelljass White-Devil-In-Lace (Kelly) Good depth of chest and length of leg, better in head of the two, needed more undercoat. Limit in Show.

 Angara Lord Luibek (Barr)
 Heavier in head and bone. Moved better later in the day.

NZ BRED DOG (2 entered)

1. Ch Skrownek Sev Kazan (Stewart/Wells) Well proportioned with good feet and nice coat, nice head and moved well. A powerful dog but heavier than I like. NZ Bred In Show. 2. Skrownek Fia Zvest (Hofmann) Similar in style but not as much drive or coat as the winner.

VETERAN DOG (3 entered)

1. Ch Karmera Maximaster At Yorkrose (Fothergill)

Very nice dog in excellent coat, moved well in the class.

2. Ch Angara Kinda Windy (Barr)
A heavier dog in good coat but not quite the head and gait of the winner.

3. Ch Samways Coolascanbe (MacMillan) Did not move as well as the others, big coat, magnificent feet and feathering.

OPEN DOG (5 entered)

1. Ch Aldonza Kid N Lace (Imp Aust) (Carleton)

Good head and in nice coat, good feet and feathering, deep chest and moved well, again heavier than I prefer. Reserve Challenge and Open In Show.

- 2. Ch Kursharn Sha Petruha (Wells) Slightly broader in skull and longer in back. Again good coat, feet and feathering.
- 3. Aust/NZ/Sgpore Ch Kimchatka The Real McCoy (Hawkins)

Not quite the coat of the 1st and 2nd, in a happy mood, nice head, good neck, good depth of chest, nice feet. Closely pushed by the remaining pair.

PUPPY BITCH (3 entered)

1. Anaky Taking Chances (Imp Aust) (Andrew)

Promising youngster, right size for her age. Nice head and body, good neck, moved well, good feet. Bitch Challenge and Reserve In Show.

Skrownek Taan Tavia (Stewart/Shugg)
 Also moved well, good chest and feet
 Skrownek Taan Tamara (Ward)
 Better head than her sister but did not move as well. Also good head, neck and feet.

JUNIOR BITCH (3 entered)


1. Kursharn Zeta Shonvee (Wells) An attractive bitch, animated nicely, broad skull, good eye, neat coat and feet.

2. Aldonza Chabli for McCoy (Imp Aust) (Carleton)

Nice head, good bone, good feet, neat coat 3. Ch Kimchatka Sweet As (Fothergill) Good mover in good coat, nice tailset. Very close class.

LIMIT BITCH (2 entered)

1. Polar Glory Rose At Kimskaya (Mathers/

size, nice head and coat, good bone. Given every chance but would not put a foot right.

NZ BRED BITCH (4 entered)

- 1. Ch Sunshine Karli (Shugg) Won it on movement, nice eyes and ears, good feet, fair coat.
- 2. Ch Zaminka Still A Kid At Heart (Barzey) Attractive head, good neck, good feet, nice stifle.
- 3. Ch Karmera The Faithful At Yorkrose (Fothergill)

Nice size, fair coat, lovely tail, good feet

VETERAN BITCH (3 entered)

1. Ch Sunshine On My Shoulder At Yorkrose (Fothergill)

Beautifully proportioned, good head, neck, shoulders, body, legs, good feet and moved well. Completely out of coat otherwise would have been challenge, had to settle for Reserve Challenge and Best Veteran In Show.

2. Kalina Southern Sauna (Imp Aust) (Kelly) Also short on coat, nice head, good neck, good feet well feathered. Huge coat, magnificent feet and feathering. Nice body and good bone, out moved by second placed.

(Note: Bob had the next two around the wrong way i.e taiza 1st and Neesha 2nd so I swapped them around.)

OPEN BITCH (2 entered)

Ch Kursharn Zenechka (Wells)
 Good head and coat, Nice ears and good eye.
 Ch Angara Taiza Tale (Barr)
 Good shape, nice bone, nice feet, good tail.
 Strong head.

3. Ch Penza Snow Mist (Kissell)

My first impression was the close resemblance your exhibits bore to ours and after opening the catalogue I understand why. The youngsters of both sexes were very promising with the bitches being more even type than the dogs. Despite their variations, the dogs fared the better in the run offs.

We have common problems particularly short upper arms and straight shoulders, neither long or short backs are rare. Length of leg must be watched, for here we have quite a few exhibits that I feel require a greater length of leg. While the feet here are not too bad, yours were much better. I felt that your guard coats could be harsher and more profuse. In my critiques of individuals I have remarked on some being heavier than I like, as the standard calls for the weight to be "in proportion to size", it did not affect any of my placings. However as reindeer are smaller than cattle, a dog as robust as a Rottweiler is not necessary. A large dog like a large car consumes more fuel, and as the Arctic is not the Garden of Eden so a dog's appetite could well be important to the tribesmen, hence my comments. I believe the weights of 45lb to 56lb for dogs and 35lb to 45lb for bitches, which were in earlier standards, should have been retained to give an understanding of the conformation of a medium sized dog who is expected to be able to work in the snow.

As breeders and exhibitors we should be concentrating on producing Samoyeds that are not only beautiful but capable of returning to the Arctic and performing the same tasks as the dogs of a century ago. Unfortunately dog shows are becoming nothing more than beauty parades. We need to compare our dogs against the pictures of that era, dogs that were the models for the original standard. We need to endeavour to breed to the standard rather than adapt the standard to what we are breeding. I was once told we should forget dogs of yesterday and progress. Have we?

Thank you for inviting me and I hope that exhibitors enjoyed the show as much as I did.

days, recheck, give for 2 more days. Because she still wasn't right, full x-rays were done on both front legs.

The vet and I were shocked to find a large bone in her paw broken. When I picked her up from the Vet's, she had a large bandage on her leg and a Hood on her head (she now had New Nick-names Hooky or Hoppity!!) The vet's instructions to me "Don't let her get the bandage wet". It has been a very wet winter and she was partly toilet-trained. So we started experimenting with different plastic bags and how to tie them on! Eevore's mission was how fast she could pull it off again! Inside water bowls became a problem. She managed to get her bandage into all sorts of bowls (including ones that hung on the cage door!) So I brought her a 'drip-feed'

water bottle to attach to the cage. She walked around on the bandage without a problem and could run as fast as her sisters (when she was allowed to play with them)

The bandage was changed after 7 days because of how fast pups grow. She had nearly worn the bottom out of the bandage! Another 7 days and the x-rays showed that the bone had healed.

It has been 2 weeks since the bandage has been off and it has taken this long for her to go back to walking on it.

The coat and skin are fine, I did dry the leg for the 1st few days when she went outside (because you could see that it was a bit itchy)

The other interesting thing is that her tail has carried on growing at the end and now has a double curl (it is a fault) but I have never seen anything like it before.

Now she just needs to find a home?
