


We still need breeders to introduce the Club to their new puppy owners but more and more through the Facebook page, which is very active, the existence of the Club and what it offers is becoming known.

## SamCare Report

Merry Christmas to everyone!

An update on what our club is doing...

We are always interested in people that would like to give a older Samoyed a new 'forever home', or people that are happy to foster a Samoyed for several weeks until we can organise a forever home.

If you are interested, please send me some info about your household and what you can offer.

I have not had to rescue any Samoyeds from the pound or dog shelters this year, because our main focus is to help Samoyeds before they end up in these places.

We are trying to educate as many people as we can before or after they have bought a Samoyed pup.

On the 17 and 18th November, we will attend the Pet Expo at Porirua again this year. This is a long day for humans & dogs, but a good way of talking to thousands of people.

On 1 October, New Animal Welfare Regulations for Dogs came in to place. It gives the Police & SPCA more power to step in.

In Short, it covers: shelter, using collars, muzzles & tethering on vehicles moving or in vehicles that get hot when parked.

There have been lots of dogs that have died in a hot car, this is why they have brought in this regulation.

It would be good for everyone to read so that you know what is acceptable and when you should tell someone about how a dog is being treated.

Christmas Present for your dog: December is a busy time for all of us, if you don't have time to groom out that winter coat and give him/her a bath and dry, now would be a good time to book into the groomers, they will feel a lot better without the heavy coat!

Remind them 'not to shave' and to use scissors to shorten coat around rear to help keep it clean or reduce weight if they have a huge coat

All new toys and blankets that are not made in NZ, should be washed before giving to your pets. There was a litter of kittens brought into my local vets. The kittens all died from sucking on their new blanket from China.





## A Samoyeds Double Coat


Please remember you should NEVER shave your Samoyed. Just keep them well groomed and provide fresh cold water and all day shade.




This is a no no!!




Coat, freshly groomed and free from undercoat.




Coat with moderate undercoat.



Coat with impacted undercoat.




Cool air can reach the skin and circulate when undercoat and mats are removed. The sun's rays will bounce off the coat.



Cool air is blocked when the undercoat starts growing in, causing the dog to overheat. The undercoat will absorb the rays due to a more porous structure, trapping the heat in.

When the coat is shaved the cool air flows above the skin.
The sun's rays penetrate whatever thin hair is left, causing the dog to overheat.
Since a dog's skin is only 6-10 layers deep (compared to a human's 16-20) they will easily sunburn.

## New Animal Welfare Regulations/Code of Welfare

1 October 2018

Set out below is a summary of the new regulations and code of welfare which came into effect as of the above date.

Links to the relevant and full set of information have also been made available below.

#### Muzzles On Dogs

Restrictive muzzles can cause your dog pain and distress.

You'll be OK if the muzzle you use meets these requirements:

 Right size and fit for each dog. A muzzle which works for one dog may not work for all.

Doesn't cause cuts, swellings or abrasions.

 Allows the dog to open its mouth for normal breathing, panting, drinking, and vomiting.

Otherwise, you can be fined \$300.

You can use a more restrictive muzzle when giving treatment, including
preventative treatment, but the dog must be under constant supervision. For
example, a vet vaccinating a dog that is a safety risk can use a restrictive
muzzle.

provided the dog isn't left unsupervised.

• Check with your local authority for specific rules if you are required to muzzle your dog.

#### Dogs must have a dry and shaded shelter

- Your dog must have access to appropriate shelter.
- Check on your dog regularly.

Your dog's shelter and living area must meet these requirements:

- Your dog can access a sheltered area at any time that is clean, dry, shaded, and ventilated – but not draughty – and protects them from extremes of heat and cold.
- The sheltered area must be big enough for the dog to stand up, turn around, and

lie down in a natural position.

- The dog has constant access to water.
- The dog's droppings and urine don't accumulate where they live.

Otherwise, you can be fined \$300.

#### Dogs left in vehicles

Leaving your dog in the car on a warm day is a risk. Dogs quickly suffer and die in hot cars.

If you leave a dog in a hot car and it becomes heat stressed, you and the owner

of the vehicle can be fined \$300.

Thinking about bringing your dog on a journey? Plan ahead and ask yourself:

- What's the weather like?
- Will you have to leave your dog in the car? How long will the dog be in the car?
- Is it better to leave the dog at home?

A hot dog seeks shade and may pant, drool, and hyperventilate.

If you see a dog suffering in a hot car, take immediate action. Find the dog owner or call the:

- Police, or
- the SPCA

#### Dogs on moving vehicles

Dogs transported unsecured on the back of trucks, utes, and trailers can fall off or hang off the side, suffering severe injuries.

You'll be OK when travelling on a public road if your dog is:

- secured in a cage or crate, or
- tied up safely when it's on the back.

If you use a rope or leash, it must:

- allow the dog to stand and lie down in a natural position
- prevent the dog from getting its legs over the side of the vehicle.

Otherwise, you and the owner of the vehicle can be fined \$300.

Farm dogs can be loose on a vehicle, including on public roads, when they are actively working.

#### Collars and Tethers

#### Collars

Poorly fitted collars can cause pain and distress. Check your dog's collar regularly. You'll be OK if the collar you use meets these requirements:

Right size and fit for each individual dog.

Allows normal breathing, panting, and drinking.

Not so tight or heavy that it can cause skin abrasions, cuts or swelling.

• Not so loose that it can cause an injury – for example, by getting its leg caught in the collar.

Otherwise, you can be fined \$300.

#### Tethers

If you need to tether your dog, make sure the tether:

 is an appropriate length and material to allow normal breathing, panting, and drinking

doesn't let the dog get caught up on nearby objects and injured.

Otherwise, you can be fined \$300.

Don't forget dogs need time off tethers for exercise.

#### Tethers

If you need to tether your dog, make sure the tether:

- is an appropriate length and material to allow normal breathing, panting, and drinking
- doesn't let the dog get caught up on nearby objects and injured.

Otherwise, you can be fined \$300.

#### Docking dogs' tails

Routine tail docking (or 'banding') is no longer allowed.

• If you dock your dog's tail or allow it to be docked, you could face a criminal conviction and fine of up to \$3,000 for an individual, or \$15,000 for the business.

If your dog's tail is injured, go to the vet.

If you see docked puppies for sale, report it to:

- MPI, or
- the SPCA

#### Removing dogs' dewclaws

There are new restrictions on removing dogs' dewclaws.

If you remove a front limb dewclaw, or an articulated hind limb dewclaw, from a
dog of any age you could face a criminal conviction and a fine of up to:

\$3,000 for an individual, or

- \$15,000 for a business
- If your dog's claws are injured, go to the vet

If you see puppies for sale that have their articulated dewclaws removed, report it to:

- MPI, or
- the SPCA

#### Report on tail docking

Due to the high interest in tail docking, MPI commissioned an independent review of the science and arguments supporting or opposing the practice. The report concluded that dog tail docking is:

- a significant surgical procedure with the potential to cause considerable pain and
  - distress
- not justified by any benefit to the dog.

## Affected parties were given a chance to comment on the report. Temporary Housing of Companion Animals (New code of welfare)

A new Code of Welfare for Temporary Housing of Companion Animals has been issued. The code has been developed by the National Animal Welfare Advisory Committee (NAWAC) and came into effect 1 October 2018.

The code sets out minimum standards and best practice guidelines for the management of animals in temporary housing facilities including the provision of food and water, temperature and lighting, air and water quality, behaviour, health and disease, and sale or rehoming.

Temporary housing facilities include but are not limited to animal welfare centres, council pounds, boarding kennels and catteries, pet shops, and animal daycare centres. The Code does not apply to temporary housing of animals by their owners, for instance at shows or exhibitions, nor does it apply to animals being held temporarily within fosterile ones or training facilities genz.org.nz/dogsnz/animal-welfare

# Grooming Day

The grooming demonstration was held at Titahi Bay Canine Obedience Club rooms and as it was a nice day we all sat outside under the veranda. There was only a small group but this enable the session to be very interactive. Everyone was aware of the importance of keeping their Samoyed well-groomed but needed assistance with some of the finer techniques.

The format for the demonstration was:

- Pre groom
- Bath
- Blow dry
- Post groom

The importance of pre-grooming prior to a bath was stressed as this is important to minimise washing dead coat and avoids a matting of dead coat with new coat. The use of the blow dryer to remove the dead coat and any mud was shown and there was quite a bit of interest in how to correctly use the blow dryer and how to get your Samoyed used to having their coat blown about and the noise of the dryer.

The use of shampoo, soap and soft brushes to obtain a deep clean with soap scum removed was discussed and how to do a quick clean if your Samoyed got dirty pants. The sponsors products – Dazzle Dog and Palamoutain Shampoo were recommended as good shampoos to use on Samoyeds and the use of lemon juice / vinegar to help clear up hot spots was explained. The diluted shampoos were applied directly to a dry coat. The importance of rinsing to ensure all the soap and shampoo were removed was stressed to avoid skin irritation and ensure the true Samoyed coat sparkle.

The use of lots of towels to remove excess water was recommended followed by dryer flicking before actually starting the blow-drying properly. It was recommended that you work from the front of the dog to the rear and use the lower speed setting for the face. The need to keep moving the nozzle and the distance away from the skin were demonstrated and there was a lot of discussion about the best type of dryer to buy and where you could buy such a dryer

The importance to brush / comb the coat while drying was demonstrated and explained as we did not want to burn the skin and the end result was a better evenness to the dry coat. People were asked to bring their own grooming tools and there was a discussion of the best tools to have, where to buy and how to use. Most people were using brushers or slickers but know now that they should be using a strong comb with medium spacing. The use of a fine comb for the face was recommended especially on older dogs that tend to not like their body done using a comb. The dryer was recommended for very old dogs.

Once the demonstration was finished the two demonstrators (Anita Shugg and Lynne Barr) helped people with specific problems and practicing the techniques demonstrated

This demonstration is part of the help sessions the Club is providing to Samoyed owners to help keep Samoyeds out of rescue and funded out of SAMCARE.

# What Is PRA?

PRA is a disease of the retina, the membrane that lines the back of the eye, and which contains the tiny receptors that record what we see, and send that information to the brain.

A dog's eye is constructed in a very similar way to your own eye. Without a retina, or with a retina that is damaged or not functioning effectively, we cannot see. And neither can our dogs.

PRA causes a gradual and incurable degeneration of the retina in both eyes, the affected dog's sight will diminish and he will eventually become completely blind.

### What does PRA stand for?

PRA stands for Progressive Retinal Atrophy. Progressive because the disease causes the dog to become progressively more blind as time goes on.

Retinal because the damage is to the retina itself

Atrophy because that's the word scientists like to use for something that is degenerating or being destroyed.

## Progressive retinal atrophy symptoms

There are several different types of PRA, and therefore symptoms may vary from one breed or one dog, to another.

Loss of vision in low light may be the first symptom, so that the dog seems to see okay during the day, but struggles in the evening or after dark

Sometimes the loss of vision will progress rapidly, in other cases more slowly.

In some types of PRA the dog will retain some peripheral vision for a long time.

### PRA diagnosis

If your dog is showing any signs of poor eyesight, or if his pupils don't seem to react normally to changes in light, these are good reasons to have him checked over by a vet.

A physical exam of your dog's eye using a special tool that shines a light through his pupil, will reveal signs of the disease once it is established. A blood test is also available which shows whether or not a dog carries the gene which causes the disease

Symptoms can first occur at any age, from a few months of to late middle age in to

### Can PRA be cured?

There is no cure for PRA. Although we cannot cure PRA, we can test for it. And this is an important part of your 'Puppy Search' journey.

People sometimes ask "should a dog with retinal atrophy be put down". Rest assured it is most unlikely that your dog will need to be euthanased due to PRA.

It is a tragic thing for a young dog to lose his eyesight, but with good care and support, most blind dogs can live happy and fulfilling lives.

#### How do we test for PRA?

PRA is an inherited disease, so if we can ensure that our puppy's parents are free from it, we can ensure that our puppies will be free from it too.

The only way to be sure your puppy won't get PRA is to ensure that his parents are both tested with good results.

There are two different ways of testing for PRA.

- We can examine the eye of a dog to see if he shows signs of the disease
  We can test the dog's DNA to see if he carries the genes that cause it.

### Lye exams

Until quite recently, the eye exam was our only test.

This was problematic as many affected dogs do not actually develop signs of the disease until they are getting on in years, and have already produced puppies.

It did give an indication to breeders as to which of their younger dogs might then be likely to be affected, but fortunately we now have a much more definitive test.

#### DNA tests

There are many different types of retinal atrophy and a company called Optigen has developed a range of tests to help breeders chose healthy dogs to breed from.

The DNA tests available for PRA are each very specific. They test for a particular variety of the disease and which test or tests are appropriate will depend on the breed.

DNA tests are particularly helpful because they identify three categories of dog

Affected dogs Carriers Clear dogs

Every dog has two copies of the gene which is responsible for the health of the rod cells in his eyes. He inherited one of these copies from each of his parents. If only one of the pair of genes is faulty, the healthy gene will over-ride it, and the disease will not develop and

### PRA Affected dogs

Affected dogs have two faulty genes and will all go on to get PRA at some point.

They will eventually lose their eyesight, sometimes at a very young age. If they are allowed to mate, they will pass their faulty gene on to all their puppies.

#### **PRA Carriers**

Carriers have one faulty gene and one healthy gene. The healthy gene will switch off the faulty gene and a carrier will never develop retinal atrophy.

He will however, be able to pass the faulty gene on to about half of all his puppies

### PRA Clear dogs

Clear dogs have two healthy genes. What PRA clear means, is that the puppy or dog can never develop retinal atrophy.

The PRA clear dog can also never pass the gene for PRA on to their puppies.

This makes them ideal candidates for breeding. But the blood test has an added bonus

If we were relying on the the eye exam alone, we would have to exclude dogs from breeding if one of their parents developed PRA. Just in case that individual was affected and would go on to develop the disease in later life.

# Breeding from carriers

The optigen test enables us to breed from carriers, provided that the carrier is mated to a clear dog, in the knowledge that none of the puppies will be affected. Some of course will be carriers themselves, and therefore must be tested before mating.

The ability to breed from carriers is a good thing, especially in breeds with a very small gene pool, as it gives us the widest possible choice of genetic material to work with. This helps to slow the inevitable loss of genetic material from our pedigree breeds.

### Checking certificates

Because the DNA test is so specific and only tests for one type of the disease, breeding animals still need an annual eye exam, even if they are DNA tested clear

So when you are choosing a puppy whose parents have been Optigen tested, you need to see not only the Optigen certificate, but also the annual eye exam certificate too.

## The future for dogs with PRA

Although we cannot cure PRA, there is some hope for treatment, in terms of prolonging the daylight vision of affected dogs

Vision in low light is dependent on retinal cells called rods. It is these cells that are destroyed by PRA. This is why dogs with PRA lose their night or evening vision first.

The retinal cells that help us see in bright light are called cones, and these are not destroyed by the disease itself, but by the toxic by-products released by the rod cells as they die.

Treatment for the future may be focused on clearing these toxic by products (which also cause cataracts) so that the dog can retain his daylight vision for much longer.

If you are worried about your puppy's eyesight, do take him along to your vet for a check up. He'll be able to give you a diagnosis and the latest information on treatment and care.

And don't forget to insist on seeing those certificates before agreeing to purchase a puppy.

# How Much Exercise Does Your Puppy Need?

We may not have exact measurements, but there are a few common sense considerations that can help you come up with a plan to keep your puppy active and healthy.

As with humans, all the recommendations in the world boil down to an inconvenient reality: the amount of exercise your puppy needs depends on your puppy.

"On the one hand, we know wolf pups run with their packs for miles. On the other, we know that the risks for a sedentary puppy with a weekend-warrior exercise pattern are worse than for a puppy that gets continuous, self-regulated exercise," says Dr. Marc Wosar, MSpVM, DACVS, an orthopaedic specialist. "Unfortunately, there are no hard-and-fast rules in these cases."

This leaves owners struggling to come up with the answers themselves. Talking with your veterinarian is a great place to start, and Dr. Kuhly cautions against spending too much time focusing on "how much exercise is too much," and instead advises owners to remember that while there are no fixed rules about what is too much exercise, not getting enough exercise over a lifetime is far more dangerous.

Your veterinarian is a great place to start your research. You can also talk to your breeder, contact breed enthusiast groups for advice, or talk to other owners about their experience with puppies of a similar breed. Most importantly, watch your puppy carefully for signs of excessive tiredness or lameness, as this could be more than just a symptom of too much exercise and could be a sign of a more serious problem

# Puppy Exercise Safety Tips

Regardless of your dog's age, there are a few safety tips that can help keep your puppy safe during exercise.

Teach your puppy how to walk on a leash

Begin with short walks, taking frequent breaks

Increase the length of the walk gradually

\* Avoid walks during the hottest and coldest parts of the day


\* Walk on safe footing, avoiding slippery or sharp surfaces
\* Call your veterinarian if your puppy shows any signs of lameness

### Types of Exercise

Puppies love to play, whether that involves romping, chasing, wrestling, or tugging. This is good news for owners, because it provides lots of variety in exercise for their pups. Variety may also help reduce some of the risks associated with repetitive exercise, and can help you bond with your new dog.

Consistency is important for puppies. Taking long runs on the weekend and short walks during the week can hurt your puppy's growing body, but consistency doesn't mean you have to repeat the same activities. Vary the type of your puppy's activities. If the weather is warm, try taking your puppy swimming to help get her used to water. Go for walks on different surfaces, like grass, wooded trails, and even pavement to help her grow comfortable in new environments. Find puppy playgroups and obedience classes, and introduce her to new toys and games.

Above all, make sure she gets at least three exercise sessions a day. Two of these could be short walks around the neighborhood to work on her leash training, while the third could be a rousing game of tug in the yard or hide-and-seek in the house. As you get to know your dog, you may find that she tells you when she is too tired to keep playing, which is your cue to enjoy a few moments of peace and quiet while your puppy takes a nap.

# Waterway Dangers

There is plenty to keep an eye out for this summer, and checking that your local water hole is safe for your dog to be able to swim and play, as we all know how much our babies love to play in the water!

Here is one easy way to check if your spot is safe this summer for your pets:

Go to:



https://www.lawa.org.nz/explore-data/swimming/

LAWA is the most comprehensive and up-to-date source of recreational water quality information for New Zealand.

#### 

- Check the water quality information for the site.
- Know how to spot potentially toxic algae in rivers or lakes so you can avoid it.
- Avoid swimming near potential sources of contamination such as flocks of birds, storm water or waste water outlets.

### Clean and clear

- Avoid swimming for at least 2 - 3 days after heavy or prolonged rain, even for sites that have good water quality.
- If you can't see your toes in calf deep water, it is best to wait until the water clears before taking a dip.



#### Environmental Hazards

- Stay safe, and look out for potential hazards (e.g. strong currents, tidal rips, underwater objects, steep drop-offs, or stinging jellyfish at beaches).
- Follow the advice in any warnings and alerts.

Once on the website, select your area from the list or picture to find out more on the water quality, what facilities are available, and other helpful information.

The chart will show you whether it is okay to swim at your favourite swimming hole, and what one is going to be best for you to take your pets to!

For here they are whole, their lives filled with gladness.


Their limbs are restored, their health renewed,


